Resources Available to families under a financial hardship

Free or Reduced Breakfast and Lunch Program: If your family meets the financial guidelines set by the state, your child may be eligible to receive free or reduced breakfast and lunches. The guidelines are based on family income and the total number of people living in your household (family members or not).

- Once eligible for this program, that eligibility is good for the remainder of that school year and the first 30 school days of the following year.
- If your application has been denied, but your family income status or the number of people in the household changes, a new application can be, and is encouraged to be filled out.
- Anyone receiving government assistance, in foster care or under homeless status (as determined by the school district) is automatically eligible for the free breakfast and lunch program.

<u>Health insurance for kids:</u> MO HealthNet for Kids (formerly MC+ for Kids) is a low-cost or free health insurance for children It is based on family income and household size. For more information call 1-888-275-5908. Your children may be eligible if they meet the following requirements:

- Family's income falls within the eligibility guidelines
- Child is without insurance for a minimum of 30 days




Kristin Holliday-Middle/High School Secretary
